MINUTES

Regular Council Meeting

At 07:30 PM, Mayor Jerry T. Fiala called the Regular City Council Meeting to order.

Opening Remarks and Pledge of Allegiance

Ms. Heidi Shaffer Bish said she was happy to see a crowded council chamber and asked all to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Introducing New Police Officers

Mayor Fiala invited Chief Nick Shearer to introduce new police officers recently hired. Chief Shearer thanked Council for the time to introduce three of the four recent hires into the police department. Chief Shearer said they were selective in the hiring process and took a little extra time to make quality hires. He introduced David Walker, who came from North Carolina, Steven Kern, who previously served as a detective for the federal government, and Derek Knapp, from Kent, Ohio. All four officers have bachelor's degrees. Mary Balwin was the fourth hire and was absent due to being on duty.

Public Comment

Mayor Fiala asked if there were any members of the public signed in to speak to Council. Ms. Wilkens said there were and called Matt Morrison to speak first.

Mayor Fiala read the following statement:

“While the law does not require Council to provide time for public comment, we have historically invited the public to make comments and we appreciate their input. This is when residents and others can comment on matters that concern them. However, we will not engage in debate, and as President of the Council, I reserve the right to end any public communication that is disruptive, embarrassing, harassing, or otherwise objectionable. We ask you to give your name and address and limit comments to three (3) minutes.”

Matt Morrison, who resides on Sunnybrook Road in Kent, asked for the City's continued support of his neighborhoods dealing with low-frequency noises. He gave Council a 59-page document that contained a petition signed by residents, notes, and complaints.

(Attachment #1) He thanked Mr. Sidoti for visiting his home and speaking with him and his wife regarding the matter. After the last town hall meeting, they were hopeful but have not received any further updates since. He thanked Law Director, Hope Jones, Joan Seidel, and Robin Turner for the help they have provided so far. He said the sounds still continued and they continue to have sleepless nights. He asked city officials to please help them.

Ms. Dianne Hadaway, who resides on Shaw Drive in Kent, described the effects the machine noise is having on her residence and her health. She works full-time from home and said they have recorded evidence. She said this is noise pollution and is adversely affecting the health of the residents. The noise ordinance does not have a special provision for industry and should be enforced. She would like to see more aggressive action by city officials. She said Land O'Lakes needs to act like a good neighbor and resolve the issue.

Ms. Candra Morrison, who resides on Sunnybrook Road, said the issue of noise from Land O'Lakes has been going on for almost a year. She said the constant disruption at night has disturbed her sleep. She added that it is suspicious that the City has not heard back from Land O'Lakes and asked the city to encourage them to mitigate the noise.

Ms. Nancy Wachsmuth, who resides on Shaw Dr. in Kent, said she has lived in Kent for two years and the sound coming from Land O'Lakes has increased dramatically over the past six months. She said she received information that the design of their roofing has changed and something they are doing has increased the sound. She said it didn't seem that they were being good neighbors. She would hate to see the value of their homes decline and ask to be heard and for some kind of compromise to occur.

Mr. Robert Shaffer, who resides on Shaw Dr. in Kent, said they love where they live and have been lifelong residents of Kent. They retired four years ago and moved into their

current home. The noise from the factory is louder than the planes, trains, and traffic on Rt. 261. The machine noise is constant and is very loud at times. He added this is noise pollution and asked the Council to put itself into their positions.

Mr. Jere Sitko, of Shaw Dr. in Kent, said he heard the noise in his condo and wondered where it was coming from. Now he knows it is from Land O'Lakes and thinks it should be a simple solution.

Ms. Lizbeth Justice of Brady Street introduced herself to Council as the Executive Director of Lovelight Inc., a local grass-roots non-profit. They are proposing a purchase of property on S. Water St. to create an intergenerational center for learning and development. She passed out a packet to Council (**Attachment #2**). She reviewed the services they would be providing and asked all for their support and how it is tied into the City's strategic initiatives.

Mayor Fiala said Council takes it seriously that residents come and voice their concerns to them. He said the administration is trying to work with Land O'Lakes in setting up a meeting and thanked everyone for attending.

Mr. Robin Turner exited the City Council Meeting at 7:52 pm and did not return.

Ms. Wallach reminded Council she had brought up the issue of low-frequency noises in the past and had to fight to keep it on the pending list. She said they need to deal with this issue.

She hopes city staff will continue to put pressure on management for this particular issue.

Ms. Rosenberg asked if the motion was in a general discussion about low-frequency noise. Mayor Fiala said the motion needed to be a general discussion, as he did not want it to delay the discussion the city is having with Land O'Lakes.

Councilmembers' Comments

Ms. Gwen Rosenberg thanked Chief Shearer for allowing Council to meet the new police officers. She said hearing the new officer's credentials is a great way to enable council members to share this information with residents and for them to be able to attend council meetings and say hello. She asked him to pass along her congratulations to them in their new positions.

Ms. Shaffer Bish thanked LoveLight for making a presentation and keeping Council informed on their progress in searching for a home for their organization. She said they are doing fundraising and asked everyone to invest, as she is intending to donate.

Mr. Sidoti reiterated what Ms. Rosenberg talked about the new police officers and added that they all looked quite young. He likes the idea that they all have degrees and thinks good training is important, as it is very valuable.

Mr. Amrhein thanked Betsy Justice from LoveLight for coming to speak to Council and said he also would be donating. He added it is a great cause and encouraged everyone to read the literature distributed, as it is extremely important.

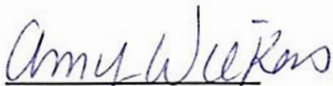

At 8:15 p.m., after hearing no further business, Council adjourned.



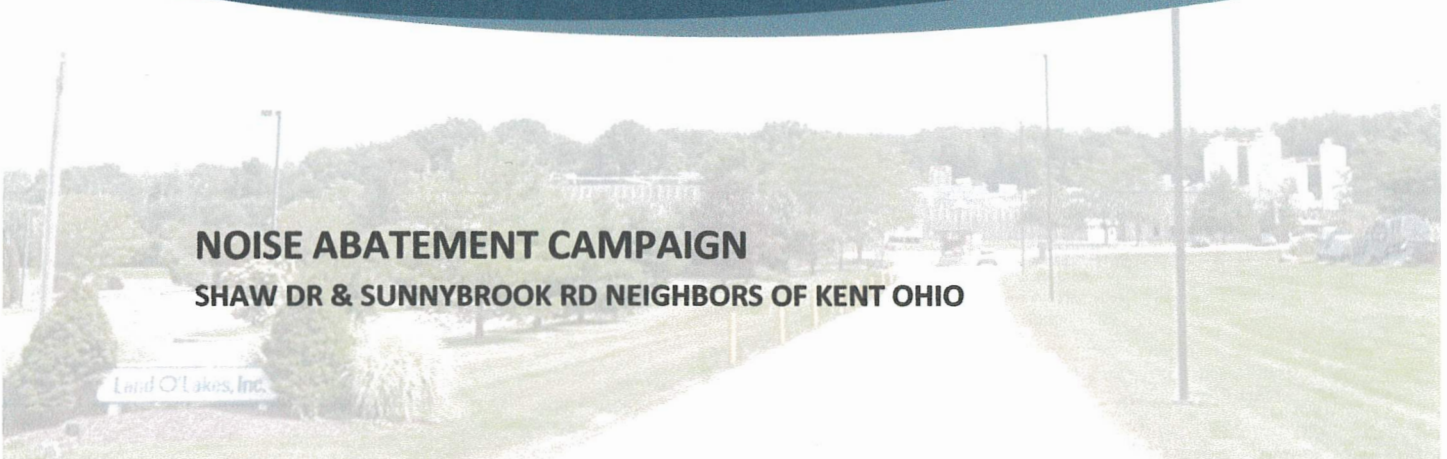

Subject: **Land O'Lakes Factory Torments Senior Neighborhood in Kent**

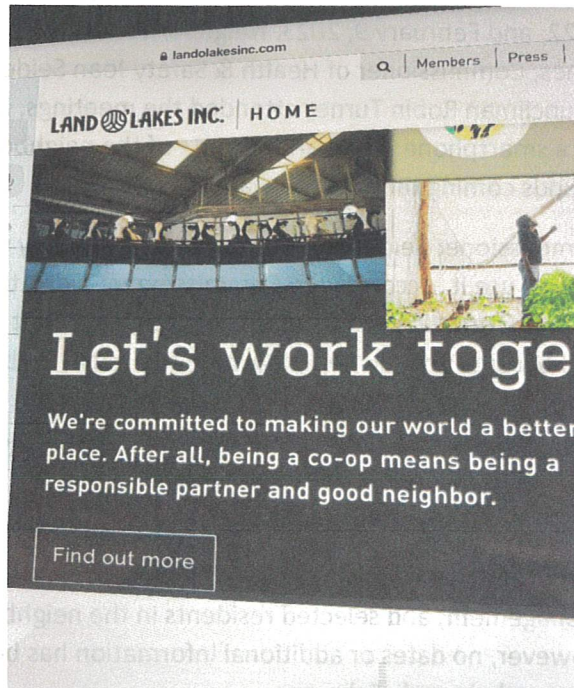
Residents of a senior community in Kent are frustrated and fatigued after months of complaining about the constant noise from a plant located just 1,200 feet away.

The Land O'Lakes factory management has long known that the loud noises from the plant torment and disrupt the sleep of neighbors in the Crossings on Golden Pond, located at Shaw Drive and Sunnybrook Road. But the management has failed to address the problem and has cut off communication with the residents.

Residents have complained of the disturbing noises running all day and night, except for occasional, much anticipated breaks during weekends. The banging and clanking, along with ongoing slow droning and quick pulsating hums, wakes the residents at all hours of the night. The droning continues throughout the day with little to no reprieve. The sounds can be heard through the walls of the homes in this neighborhood. Making trying to fall asleep or even stay asleep a daunting task. Many residents report hearing it above the audio of their TVs and can feel vibrations through their walls. One neighbor has said he can physically feel the vibrations.

Land O'Lakes has been operating in Kent since 1982, but the noise problem is more recent. Both residents and city officials have reached out to the plant management. At first, Land O'Lakes operations management was willing to work with the neighbors directly. The plant management acknowledged that there was a problem and was willing to help find the cause. Then all communications shut down, presumably on orders from the corporate office.

A petition signed by 59 residents asked Land O'Lakes management to install sound abatement material around their refrigeration units and HVAC Systems to silence and contain the problem sounds. Statements from residents said they did not want to take sleeping medication but found it to be the only way to sleep. Several women discussed crying during the night when they couldn't fall asleep. Others described the frustration of having to wear earplugs every night in their own homes.



The headline of a US News article by HealthDay News, dated February 1, 2023, reads "Sleeping Pills Linked to High Risk for Dementia." The article says that seniors who frequently take sleeping medication may be raising their risk for developing Alzheimer's Disease. The article also states that researchers had found that older adults who often took sleep aids had a 79% chance of developing dementia compared to those who never or rarely used them. That makes up most of the demographics of this neighborhood.

City officials met with residents of Shaw Drive and neighbors on Sunnybrook Road on December 29, 2022, and February 9, 2023. Neighborhood attendance was 25 and 35, respectively. Law Director Hope Jones, Commissioner of Health & Safety Joan Seidel, Councilmember-at-Large Roger Sidoti and Ward 3 Councilman Robin Turner attended the meetings. In one of the meetings, a resident played videos taken on a smartphone from various parts of the neighborhood and even of their bedroom to show the sounds coming through the wall.

Commissioner Seidel tracked complaints on a city website, but many of the senior residents were not able to use it. According to Commissioner Seidel, the website received 98 reports of loud, disturbing sounds from the Land O'Lakes plant. One resident tracked the nightly noises on a steno pad next to her bed because she did not know how to use the website. Health Commissioner Seidel also had her employees test for sound decibels. Many of those sounds coincided with website complaints by the residents. However, most of the neighbors' complaints referred to loud noises during the middle of the night when there was no tracking done by the city. Noises were so loud that they were awakened from a sound sleep, night after night.

City officials reached out to Land O'Lakes to request a meeting between Plant Management, City Management, and selected residents in the neighborhood to discuss the issue and come to a resolution. However, no dates or additional information has been communicated to the residents since that request was made in early February.

The residents of Shaw Drive and Sunnybrook Road want Land O'Lakes to be the good neighbor they so proudly claim to be by installing sound-abatement material as soon as possible.

Synopsis

September 2022

- Calls to Land O'Lakes management from Sunnybrook Rd resident on behalf of neighborhood. Discussions with plant management and neighbors about the disturbing noises coming from their facility continue throughout October. Conversations clearly conveyed noises louder than times past, disrupting sleep nightly, noises are heard inside homes coming through the walls.
- The ask from the neighborhood is Land O'Lakes fix the machines that are making the noises or contain the noises with sound abatement materials that are readily and easily available for industrial roof top HVAC units, Refrigeration Units, Generators, or other continuously running industrial machinery.

October 2022

- Call to EPA, advised that the sound is a violation however no decibel levels defined in Ohio and City Council would need to enforce local ordinances.
- Discussion with Kent Police, advised not a criminal act and City Council would need to enforce the sound ordinance.

November 2022

- Call to Community Development of Kent (Paul Bauer), the department reached out to Land O'Lakes about the noises.
- Community Development advises Land O'Lakes told Community Development that their facility doesn't make the noises the neighborhood is hearing, Paul Bauer suggested neighbors call Law Director for more explanation on how to get a resolution.
- Call to Robin Turner Ward 3 representative. Mr. Turner advised that the neighborhood should work together to gather signatures and arrange a time for city officials to discuss the issue in a town hall setting

December 2022

- Neighbors gather signatures on petition and schedule a town hall meeting
- 12/29/2022 Residents hold first town hall meeting with Hope Jones Law Director of Kent, Joan Seidel Health Commissioner, Roger Sidoti Councilman at Large, Robin Turner Ward 3 Councilman, and 25 neighbors

January 2023

- City does investigation to determine source and severity of noise issue

February 2023

- 2/9/2023 Residents hold second town hall with Hope Jones Law Director of Kent, Joan Seidel Health Commissioner, Robin Turner Ward 3 Councilman, and 35 neighbors discuss results of investigation
- City officials promise to foster a meeting between Land O'Lakes, members of Shaw Dr and Sunnybrook Rd, City Management, Board of Health, and Community Development of Kent
- The week of February 13th City of Kent Official reach out to Land O'Lakes to request meeting, no updates provided to residents since request

March 2023

- Residents go to council formally to present petitions and statements and request additional and further support to aggressively resolve this noise issue and health concern as soon as possible

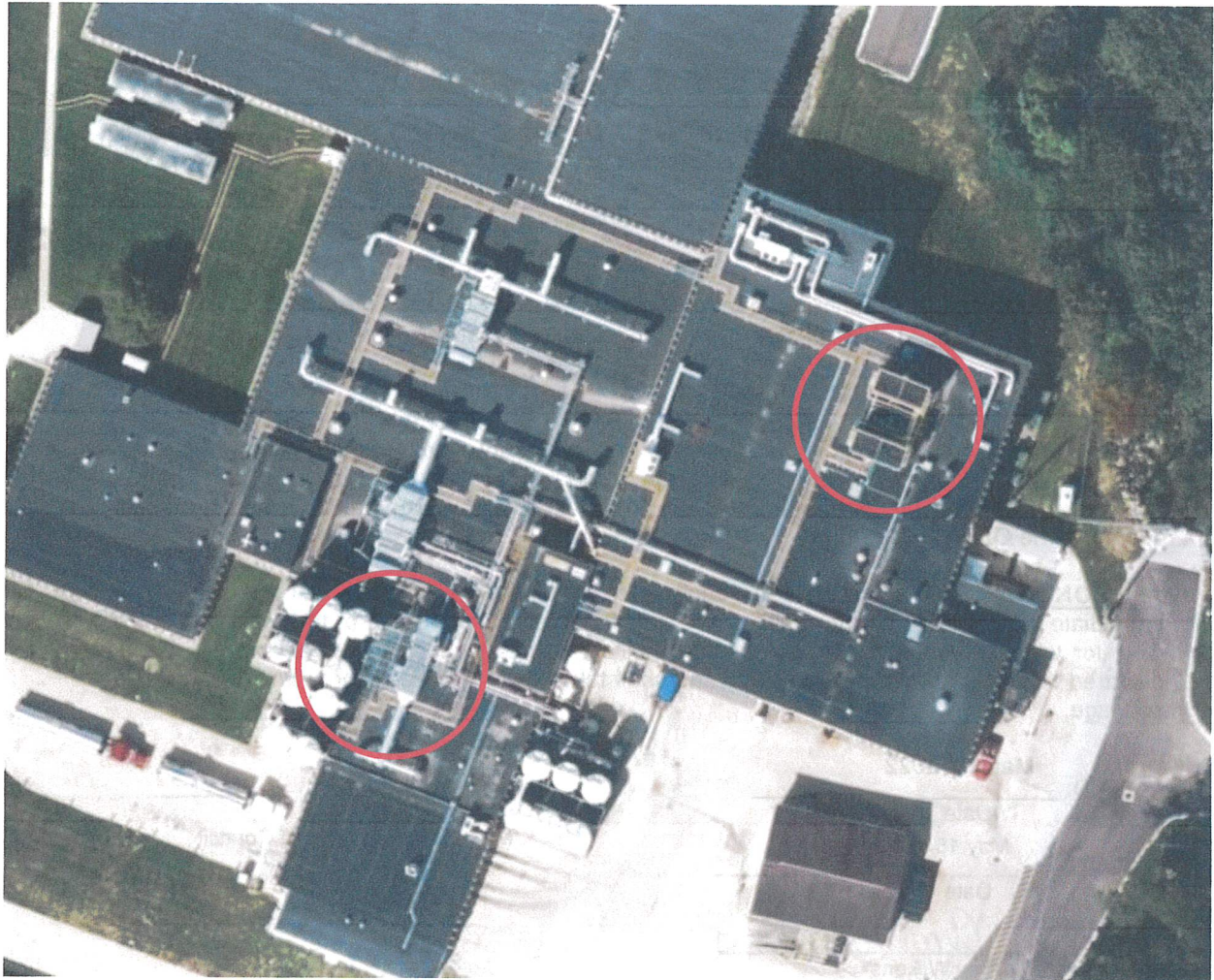
Sound Map

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-053

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 509.12 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KENT TITLED "UNLAWFUL NOISE", AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Kent, Portage County, Ohio, that:

SECTION 1. Kent City Council does hereby amend Section 509.12 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Kent titled "Unlawful Noise" per the Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council, and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3. this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the residents of this City, for which reason and other reasons manifest to this Council this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force immediately after passage.

EXHIBIT A

509.12 UNLAWFUL NOISE

(a) **Unlawful Noise - Prohibited.** It is unlawful for any owner, occupant, agent or persons in possession or control of any structure, lot, thing or building, premises or vehicle to make, continue or cause to be made or continued, or permit to be made, any excessive, unnecessary, or unusually loud noise or any noise which disturbs, annoys, injures or endangers the comfort, repose or health, peace or safety of persons of ordinary sensibilities within the City.

(b) **Unlawful Noise - Enumerated.** The following acts, among others, are declared to be loud, disturbing, injurious and unnecessary and unlawful noises in violation of this section, but this enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive, namely:

(1) **Horns and Signal Devices.** The sounding of any horn or signal device on any automobile, motorcycle, bus or train, or any other vehicle while not in motion, except as a danger signal or to give warning of intent to get into motion, or, if in motion, only as a danger signal after or as brakes are being applied and decelerating of the vehicle has begun; the creation by means of such signal devices of any unreasonably loud or harsh sounds; and the sounding of any signal device for any unreasonable or unnecessary period of time.

(2) **Radio, Stereo, Musical Instruments.** The playing of any radio, stereo, television set, amplified or unamplified musical instruments, loudspeaker, tape recorder, or other electronic sound-producing devices, in such a manner or with such volume at any time or place so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any office or in any dwelling, hotel, hospital or other type of residence, or of any persons in the vicinity. ~~The operation of any such set, instrument, phonograph, machine or device in such a manner as to be plainly audible on a property or in a dwelling unit other than that in which it is located, shall be prima facie evidence of a violation of this section.~~

(3) **Loud Noises or Disturbances.** Yelling, shouting, hooting or the making of any other loud noises on the public streets, or the making of any such noise at any time or place so as to annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of persons in any dwelling, hotel, hospital or other type of residence, or in any office or of any persons in the vicinity.

(4) **Animal Noises.** The keeping of any animal, which by causing frequent or long continued noise shall disturb the comfort or repose of any person.

(5) **Whistle or Siren.** The blowing of any whistles or sirens, except to give notice of the time to begin or stop work or as a warning of fire or danger.

(6) **Engine Exhaust.** The discharge into the open air of the exhaust of any engine, or internal combustion engine, except through a muffler or other device which effectively prevents loud or explosive noises therefrom.

(7) **Noisy Advertising.** No person shall, by ringing a bell or gong, or by using a phonograph or other instrument for producing or reproducing sounds, or by using loud or boisterous language or by any unusual noise or means whatever, advertise goods, wares, or merchandise for sale, or advertise any show, theater, exhibition, or entertainment.

(8) **Noisy Machinery.** No person shall maintain, run, or operate any steam, gas, gasoline, or other engine, boiler, press, machine, or other apparatus so constructed or operated as to make any unnecessary noise, to the annoyance and discomfort of the people of the City, except in the course of making an emergency repair and for weather necessitated activities.

(9) **Noise-producing Instruments.** The use of any device, apparatus, radio, ticker or other noise-making and noise-emitting device for general advertising purposes, or for the purpose of soliciting trade or attracting attention to any wares, good, merchandise, instrument or device offered for sale is prohibited.

(c) **Sound Generated by Devices or Instruments.** It is prima facie unlawful for a person to generate or permit to be generated sound by the above described devices or instruments in the following circumstances:

(1) On private property between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. of the following day in a residential area where the sound is **unreasonably** audible past the property line of the property on which the source of the sound is located; or

(2) On a street, highway or in the public right-of-way where the sound is audible thirty (30) feet from the device generating the sound. Persons in possession of a current parade permit, assemblage permit, or a current loud-speaker permit are exempt from the provisions of this sub-paragraph.

(3) By conducting an unduly large gathering at a private residence or in a private residential area which generates excessive noise at any time.

(d) No person being the owner, or person in possession of a premises for person in control of the premises by reason of employment, agency, or otherwise, whether such ownership, possession or control is exclusive or joint, shall permit a violation of this section.

(e) **Warning and Alarm Devices** Warning and alarm devices which have the purpose of signaling unsafe or dangerous situations or calling for police are exempted from the prohibitions of this section when used for such purposes and are in proper working order.

(f) **Agricultural Activities.** Agricultural activities conducted within an agricultural district as authorized in Chapter 929 of the Ohio Revised Code, shall be exempted from the prohibitions of this section when the activities are not in conflict with federal, state or local laws or are conducted in accordance with generally accepted agricultural practices.

(g) **Outdoor Performances** The use, production or presentation outdoors in a residential neighborhood, by a live band of any make-up, or the use of outdoor amplification or amplification intended directly or indirectly to be heard outside of the structure where the event is being held.

(h) **Exemptions** Events officially sponsored and/or approved by the City of Kent, such as festivals, fireworks, parades, etc., activities that are essential to the proper performance work-related duties of the officers and employees of the City, and events official sponsored by governmental educational institutions and the Kent Board of Education such as sporting events, marching bands, etc., shall be exempt from the prohibitions of this section.

(i) **Retaliation.** No person shall direct a verbal, physical or electronic act against the person, family or property of any individual who complains of or witnesses a violation of

the Unlawful Noise regulations for the purpose of intimidating or retaliating against that person for the exercise of the right to complain or testify to a violation of this Code.

(j) Penalty

(1) Whoever violates this section except subsection (i) is guilty of generating unreasonable noise an unclassified misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000 and up to thirty (30) days in jail. If the offender persists in generating, or permitting to be generated, unreasonable noise after reasonable warning or request to desist, the penalty shall include a minimum fine of \$500.00.

(2) Whoever violates subsection (i) herein, is guilty of an unclassified misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of at least \$500.00 and not exceeding \$1,000 and up to thirty (30) days in jail.

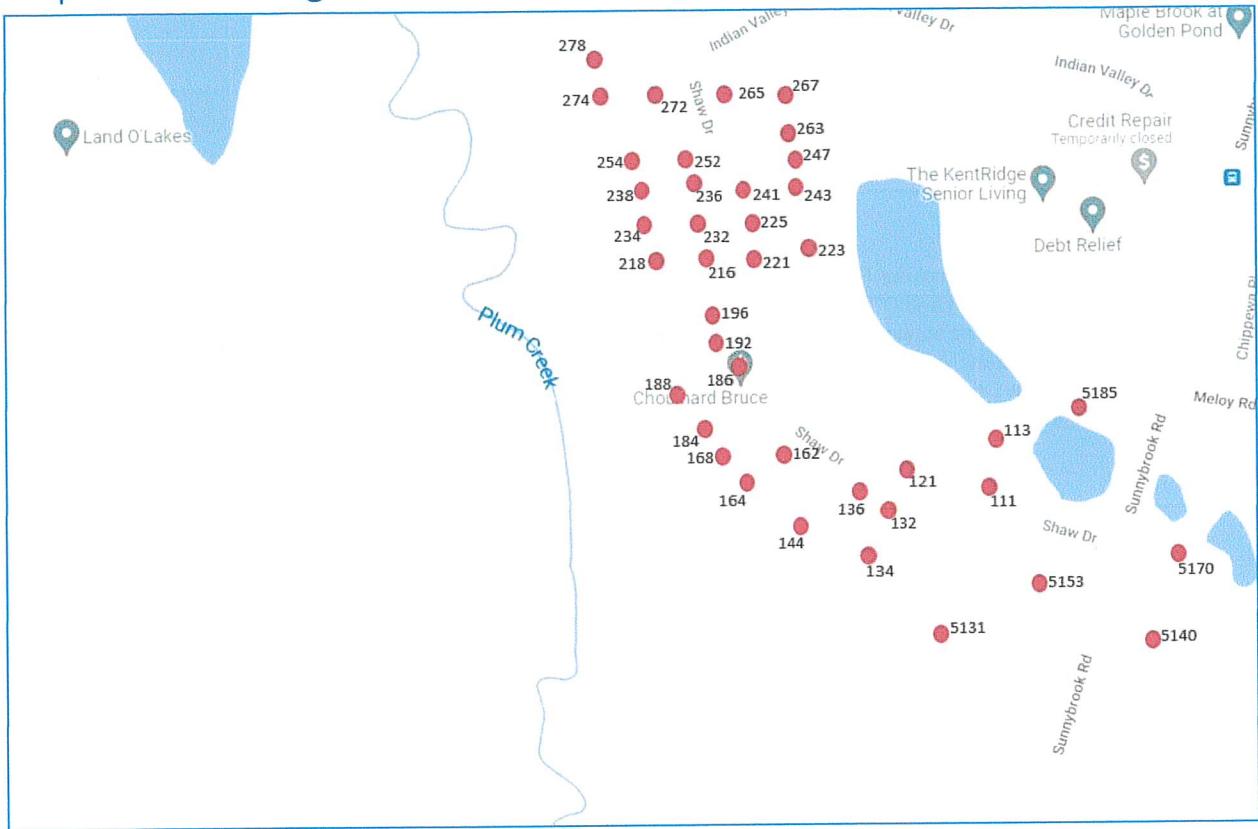

The noise from LO'L Plant has been here since I moved here in April of 2021. The noise has gotten worse as far as being loud. The first night we moved here, I was in bed and heard the noise for the first time and got out of bed because I thought my husband left the car running in the garage. He said he did not do any such thing. I went in the garage and it was not the car running, it was the noise coming from the LOL Plant. The loudness of the noise just keeps getting worse. It is enough to drive a person crazy especially at night when you are trying to sleep. Even in the summer trying to relax on the patio, the noise is so annoying. Recently one night when my 13 year old granddaughter stayed over night, the next morning she told me she heard the noise all night. She thought the noise was coming from my refrigerator. She did not realize the noise she heard was coming from outside. The noise is non stop day and night. If it stops it is only for 5 minutes and then it starts back up again. I am in tears a lot of nights because I have no place to go to escape from the noise so I can fall asleep. My bedrooms are the worse rooms for the noise. On Saturday and Sundays I do not hear the noise. The plant must not be in operation on the weekends. Wednesday, January 25 I sent a form in at 3:30 AM. The noise was exceptionally loud that night. We could not sleep. I finally went back to bed at 5:10 AM and fell asleep. Not because the noise stopped, but because I was totally exhausted from being up all night because of the noise. There are a lot of elderly people living in this condo neighborhood. A lot of them probably do not know how to fill out the form and to submit it. I was one of them at first. I still am wondering if I am filling it out and submitting it correctly. I know my husband would never fill it out because he does not use the computer. So I am sure you would probably have a lot more forms being turned in if some of the elderly knew how to do it. Statement regarding the Land O'Lakes Plant

When we downsized six years ago from our home on the shores of Lake Erie, we never thought that we could move to a place that would compare. To our delight, we moved into wonderful community where we are happy even without the sunsets on the lake. The neighbors are wonderful, great activities, pool, workout room and close proximity to Family and downtown Kent. Plus, our new home is just beautiful. What could be better!

For the past couple years, I have been experiencing low-grade headaches almost daily, although if we were gone all day, I had no headache. I thought it was my allergies. We spend the Winters in Florida, and I don't get the headaches there. This summer, we were aware that the noise from the Land O'Lakes plant seemed louder. We can't even open our windows to let in Spring breezes. When we are in bed at night, we could hear the loud droning of machinery. I buy the Land O'Lakes whipped butter at least 3 or 4 times per month and I tell my husband that they are churning my butter. For so many nights the noise is so loud that I must take a sleeping pill to fall asleep. Taking sleeping pills are not good for anyone. Often, there is loud banging that wakes us up, usually around 3 to 4 am, it sounds like machinery starting up. The loud noise sometimes goes in cycles of stopping and starting. When I'm in my sunroom, I'm aware of the loud sounds coming from the LO'L that can be heard over my TV.

Before we left for Florida on January 7th, I wrote on the website several times whenever I heard the disturbing noise. I realized that If I was home all winter, I would only go to the website occasionally, not daily or several times weekly. And that would be a problem. I truly appreciate our community having the ability to report the disturbances on the website although many of our neighbors do not use the computer.

We live in a beautiful senior community with condos selling in the \$300K. When we purchased our property, we were not even aware that there were railroad tracks behind our home, let alone a factory. We have been told that the sounds are from the trains. NO, the train whistle announces the train, and the train is gone after a few minutes.

In this highly technical age, there are many choices of sound abatement materials available. Land O'Lakes is not a poor company, but a very successful one with quality products. Their balance sheet indicates that they are more than capable of doing something to ensure our quality of life without their disturbing sounds. City Officials are trying to measure the sound with meeting decimal sound levels. Unless you come into our bedroom at 11:30 at night or in my sunroom, you are not getting the full picture. Our lives and health are affected by disruptions to our sleep by these disturbing sounds.

What are the remedies? If the noise continues, we are not going to accept this intrusion into our lives. It is time for City Officials to look for money in the Governor's office in COVID relief money to assist Land O'Lakes. But if not, what are our next choices??? We can't live like this.

This situation is fixable.

I believe that the City of Kent Officials will do what is right in protecting its most vulnerable residents who deserve a good quality of life.

I am presenting this statement in addition to the comments I submitted via a website from City of Kent Health & Safety. I have no way of knowing if those comments were successfully received.

The noise was first noticeable to me in Sept or Oct of this year. I have lived at this location since 2013. While I may recall hearing a humming noise outside, I was never bothered by it. Now the 'hum' is constant 24/7 Mon-Fri. It sounds like the equipment is now shut down early Sat morning and started up again early Mon morning.

My bedroom is on the driveway facing East towards the woods and Land O Lakes factory. The head of my bed is on the garage side South and East. Noise on m wall is loud and pulsating, fading in and out and sometimes not audible for 30 seconds before starting up again. Almost vibrating... nighttime is when it bothers me the most. To move the location of the bed would not make appreciable difference.

Most nights I can 'self-talk' thru bedtime with difficulty sometimes reverting to moving to the living room couch or guest room. Sleep aids are a last resort.

Trains and 'dumps' from Shelly Co. Don't bother me. This noise is constant. Interrupted with variables of intensity and decibels. It's annoying and sometimes debilitating.

I am hoping for a company 'fix' to correct an obvious problem that has fallen on our community.

Noises from Land O'Lakes

We moved into 5185 Sunnybrook Rd in June of 2021. The first year of living in this neighborhood we learned how lucky we were to find this property. The neighborhood is quiet and has a small community of friendly folks that surrounds us. One of the many perks that my wife and I noticed that first year was when we had the windows open in the back of our house, we could hear the fountains in the pond behind our property. We took advantage of this several nights in 2021 and the first half of 2022.

In the middle of the summer of 2022, we were woken up around 3:30am to the sound of this pulsating droning hum that we never heard since we moved in. It was unnerving and since we both were awake, we were listening outside trying to figure out if it was a plane in the distance or an idling vehicle parked somewhere, but we couldn't determine. We closed the windows and annoyingly to our surprise the humming noise could be heard coming right through the walls, keeping us awake. The noise stopped around midmorning, and we don't recall hearing it the rest of that week with this first experience. As time went on over the summer and into the fall the noise would return and we would hear it overnight once a week, then sometimes twice a week, then it would continue throughout the day, to the point that it was pulsating and droning, or producing a constant hum 3-4 days and nights a week, every week.

On one of our evening walks through the neighborhood in early September 2022 we realized while we were near the cul-de-sac on Shaw Drive, that it was the Land O'Lakes facility on the other side of the woods behind the condos. I called Land O'Lakes directly and spoke with Eric Love (plant manager) about the noises. We had steady dialogue weekly, around fixing this issue until mid-October. Our interactions stopped in November, that's when I asked the City of Kent to help with the problem noises.

These noises have been steadily disrupting our sleep since September of 2022. The sound cannot be ignored when trying to sleep, due to the constant hum or pulsating and constant droning rhythm it produces. In a desperate attempt at soundproofing our home I had the exterior walls reinsulated on 11/29/2022. The low frequency sounds still penetrate through our walls and keep us awake.

For months I have been taking 3 over-the-counter sleeping pills(Diphenhydramine HCl 25mg, more than the 2-pill recommended dose) to force myself to fall asleep through the sound, however I find that it will help me fall asleep while the noise is going, the noise will still wake me up after a couple hours. My wife and I each purchased white noise machines to help mask the sound, however the tone is still heard when the white noise devices are both going. I have lost track of how many weeks I have been kept awake 2-3 days in a row with no actual sleep. Outside of the many health issues that sleep deprivation presents, I notice myself getting anxiety when I hear anything that remotely resembles the tone. On nights when the sound is not being made, I find myself not being able to sleep due to the anxiety of worrying about it starting up again. It is wearing on my physical and mental wellbeing. The lack of sleep is impacting my production at work, my memory, I look physically different from the constant sleep deprivation, anytime I am not at home I find myself easily dozing off (such as when driving) because of how little sleep I get during the week. City officials have described this as being a disruption of "my quality of life". It is beyond that; **this is sound torture**. The noise is an intrusive sound that I am having to deal with inside the walls of my own home. I cannot escape the sounds and it robs me of sleep weekly.

Land O'Lakes boasts about making the world a better place, being responsible partners and good neighbors. Even stating they are a force for good in our communities – and for our planet – and it is a role they take seriously. I am begging Land O'Lakes to please work with our city officials and immediately abate these noises produced at the facility located in Kent, OH for the health and safety of the impacted nearby residents.

Land O' Lakes Statement

The first 5 months of 2021, my husband & I looked at 3 to 4 houses a week during the hottest housing market we have seen in decades. But the moment we saw the home on Sunnybrook Rd, we knew it was the one for us. This was our dream home. We even said that if the offer we made on it wasn't accepted, we were going to stop house hunting & wait. Thankfully, our offer was accepted & we were able to move in June 2021.

That first summer, it was so nice to be able to have our windows open or sit out on our newly built patio & enjoy how incredibly quiet the neighborhood was. There was no noise from neighbors & we could hear the fountains in the pond behind us. So serene! We frequently slept with the windows open, the sounds of the fountains lulling us to sleep.

This past summer, we started hearing a rhythmic humming noise randomly at night & sometimes during the day. Throughout the summer the noise became more & more frequent, day or night, to the point of being consistent every week by the end of August. It was around this time we realized on one of our walks down Shaw Dr, that the noise was coming from the Land O' Lakes factory. We knew this because we can see it through the trees behind the condos & it was the loudest right there. By early September, we were being kept awake or woken up by this pulsating humming noise multiple nights per week, as well as hearing throughout our work day(we both work from home).

We have been doing what we can to block out the noise. We've reinsulated the walls of the house, we sleep with sound machines on either side of our bed, we take sleeping pills & melatonin. Nothing helps us to sleep through the night because the noise comes through our walls keeping us awake or waking us if we do fall asleep. As the months have gone on, we are having chronic headaches, our anxiety is higher, & our exhaustion is showing in our production at work. Throughout this process & talking with the senior citizens in our neighborhood, it is heartbreaking to hear how much pain they are in being so close to this noise & how much it is affecting their health. I know how much pain we are in & it is worse for them. It's awful.

I can't express enough gratitude to the city for helping us with our request. I hope Land O' Lakes will listen to us & be the "good neighbor" they claim to be on the mission statement that they have on their website.

1st Townhall Notes from December 29th, 2022 - 6:30pm

Following are notes of the Town Hall Meeting on December 29, 2022 with City of Kent officials regarding the disturbing sounds coming from the Land O'Lakes plant.

In attendance: 18 Crossings residents (7 representing couples) 7 Sunnybrook residents and City Officials: Robin Turner, our Ward 3 Councilman; Roger Sidoti, At-Large Councilman; Hope Jones, Law Director; Joan Seidel, Commissioner of Health & Safety.

Matt Morrison (Sunnybrook Rd) introduced the City Officials and gave his background of contacting the management of Land O'Lakes, beginning in September, regarding the disturbing sounds emanating from the plant. Matt Morrison was able to record the sounds on his phone and play through his home sound system. The noise is heard throughout his home.

Councilman Robin Turner had talked to City Departments regarding the disturbing sounds emanating from the plant. The Operations Manager, Eric Love was not willing to discuss the problem with him or attend our meeting due to legal ramifications. They stated the noise is not from their plant.

Del Tekieli (232) read two statements from neighbors regarding the sounds - Nancy Wachsmuth (234) & Caroline Lotzgeselle (263). Del mentioned the petition (for Land O'Lakes management to abate the sounds) with 58 signatures.

Karen Dobrilovic (111) said she called the Police at 3:45 am one morning because of the loud sounds coming through her home. She said that she doesn't get returned calls from plant and hasn't slept well in 6 or 8 months.

Councilman Sidoti asked about shift changes -two or three possibly causing sounds or product changes (has three shifts). Councilman Sidoti said that he has driven to our street numerous times and hasn't heard anything. Health Commissioner Joan Seidel said she has sent staff to check on sounds, but they haven't heard anything. (We know they must get out of their cars.)

Robert Shaffer (278) suggested that the sounds mimic dumping metal, blowers and at time, someone is also playing a loud boom box (possibly someone on break).

Jere Sitko (267) stated that when he walks his dog to the top of the street, the sounds are very loud.

Larry Schmersal (254) flies his drone over the plant and says the sounds are coming from the four cooling towers.

See below



Councilman Sidoti questioned if the sounds could be from the other plant. Nancy Paulus (168) stated that the other plant is closed on Sunday, and she could still hear the noise from L'OL plant.

Matt Morrison had several conversations with Eric Love, Plant Manager, who first admitted there was a problem and was willing to work with him, then refused to take or answer his calls. Matt researched specific sound barriers for industrial continuous-running rooftop equipment that he shared with Eric Love.

Our own Larry Schmersal (254) has had extensive experience with sound abatement.

Councilman Robin Turner heard the sounds when he visited Matt's home when Matt played it through his sound system. He stated that the City Officials must determine if there is anything in City Law that covers this situation. It could fit under Nuisance law, but it was designed for students' parties. He also mentioned zoning laws.

Ms. Jones said our properties are 1,700 ft. from the plant. Nancy Paulus (168) said that this is the loudest in three years.

Sue Schmersal (254) asked about environmental issues. This is a major consideration.

Del Tekieli (232) asked what steps the City would take next. The Law Director Hope Jones, said they would talk with the Operations Manager, Eric Love.

Judy Filippone (186), who lives directly across from the Clubhouse, said that noise was louder in September and Fall (when the leaves were still on). Others agreed.

Ed Tekieli (232) asked if City Inspectors have checked plant. Cindy Marsh (Sunnybrook) asked if residents on Mogadore Road heard the noise.

Councilman Turner mentioned that the topography of area makes a difference. He asked that we give the City Officials a little time to work with the plant management. The City Officials will meet as a group to decide how to proceed. Then meet with plant management. Law Director Jones said they would send a letter as a start.

Councilman Turner said that we won't do this as adversarial, but diplomatically.

Kevin Williams (113) asked who will do what next? Get them to admit the problem.

Law Director Jones said that we may have to institute a civil lawsuit if LOL won't make any changes.

Karen Dobrilovic (111) suggested that we should call Chanel 19 News. Law Director Jones discouraged that action. Del Tekieli (232) said to let's try to do this diplomatically to give them a chance to be good neighbors. Del thanked the City Officials for attending and the meeting ended.

After the meeting concluded, Crossings' Board member, Bob Heim, told Councilman Sidoti about hearing the sound recently. It sounds like equipment rotating with a bad bearing or that is out of round.

Bob and Mr. Sidoti also discussed the likelihood of vibrations from the plant equipment being transmitted via the ground and bedrock underlying the area. (Bedrock is 1,500 to 2,500 ft below ground.)

2nd Townhall Notes from February 9th, 2023 - 6:30pm

Following are minutes of the City of Kent officials meeting with residents of the Crossings at Golden Pond Condominium (Crossings) and nearby residents from Sunnybrook Road, regarding the disturbing sounds coming from the Land O'Lakes (LOL) Plant on Mogadore Road.

Attendees from the City of Kent included: Hope Jones – Law Director, Joan Seidel – Commissioner of Health & Safety, Robin Turner - Ward 3 Councilman, and a student (Joe) from Kent State who was involved in the recent test recordings made by the city.

Approximately 36-40 residents of the Crossings and nearby neighborhood were in attendance.

Matt Morrison, nearby Sunnybrook resident, opened the meeting with introductory remarks and highlights of his meetings and discussions with Roger Sidoti – At-Large Councilman, associated with their observations and recordings of the sounds coming from the LOL Plant. The sounds were heard by Matt and Roger at various points on Shaw Drive and the neighborhood, at Matt's home on Sunnybrook, as well as over at the LOL Plant.

Matt also brought sound equipment to the meeting and used it to demonstrate for the attendees, his recordings at a variety of different times and locations. His recordings included both normal sounds at the various locations and from times when the disturbing sounds were observed and recorded. Most attendees concurred that Matt had captured the disturbing sounds accurately.

Nancy Wachsmuth, Unit 234 Crossings resident, stated she had a hearing test earlier today and has 30% loss of hearing and still hears noise inside her home. She then paraphrased a statement from Del Tekieli, Unit 232, who was unable to attend the meeting, regarding the disturbing sounds that may contribute to health issues and the need for a solution. Nancy also asked a question about whether LOL Plant employees are required to wear ear protection, which could not be answered by the attendees.

Various other residents of the Crossings made comments about their written statements and the disturbing sounds, including: Karen Dobrilovic, Unit 111 on Shaw Dr and Diane Hadaway, Unit 225 on Shaw Dr. Karen noted that the sounds from her perspective are at their worst between the hours of 2 and 5 AM in the morning. This time period was also consistent with the comments made earlier by Matt about the disturbing sounds keeping him awake during the night. Diane noted the case when her daughter was staying overnight and trying to sleep in their guest room which faces Shaw Dr. Her daughter was unable to sleep because of the noise, she stated sounded like a helicopter outside her window all night and Diane had to get her earplugs.

Another resident noted that there were also banging noises coming from the plant in the early hours of the morning. Others agreed and noted that the banging could be coming from Republic's waste collections. Matt talked about the trash removal scenario with Roger and Roger advised that the collection was not supposed to happen until after 7am, Roger mentioned to Matt that he had a part in that city ordinance. Hope Jones commented about other problems with collections by Republic in the city and noted that she could deal with that situation. Matt agreed that the banging noise was an easy fix if it was the trash removal however the main concern is the humming.

Hope said she had talked to City Manager and wanted to bring in Land O'Lakes to talk and ask them to be good neighbors and to investigate sound barriers. She also stated that Kent had gotten rid of any decibel laws, she is doing research on other cities and states for their sound and decibel laws. Someone on council (Tracy Wallach) asked for Low Frequency Noises to be on the year's council agenda. Officials reached out to Kent State for a sound engineer and have not gotten a response (university may not be comfortable with the project)

Law Director Hope Jones and Health Commissioner Joan Seidel then presented a package of materials (Attached) including charts and graphs related to the recordings of sound levels made by various individuals on behalf of the city at four points around the area and a control point in the city. Joan also noted that in total 98 separate entries, from 15 different addresses, had been made to the website that she had created to capture the specific dates, times, and locations of the disturbing sound events recorded by residents.

Joan spoke of the equipment used, explaining they were using smart phones with apps, not professional devices also acknowledged that no recording were taken in the evening or from inside anyone's homes.

It should also be noted that a number of statements from residents were collected by Del Tekieli and are available to further document their experiences with the disturbing sounds and related impacts upon their lives.

In summary, Hope Jones and the other City officials were concurring with the group of residents that there is a problem/situation with the disturbing sounds, and that they are coming from the LOL Plant.

Further discussion centered around Regulations regarding sound levels. Matt noted his inquiries with the EPA and searches into city and state regulations on sound levels. However, the general conclusion from this discussion was that there are no specific regulations on low frequency sounds that apply in this situation. Hope agreed and also noted that the city does not have the expertise or equipment for measuring low frequency sounds at this point.

At about this point in the discussions, the emphasis shifted to the next steps.

Matt asked what the next steps were and when can we expect updates, stated that the neighborhood is holding their breath and being as patient as possible but meanwhile this noise continues weekly disrupting everyone's sleep and wellbeing. Robin mentioned several times the neighborhood could do whatever we felt was necessary and asked for ideas. Matt mentioned that at the beginning of the meeting he complimented the neighborhood on being patient and not making this public, but we aren't being given any solid commitments. Matt stated that this is a health concern and when this meeting is over everyone goes home, the neighborhood would still hear the noise at 2:30am, so the frustration will continue.

The conversation shifted to avoiding going public, Robin said if we do go public we would cut off our nose to spite our face because of property value concerns.

Matt noted for Robin and the attendees that Roger Sidoti had suggested to him that he attend an upcoming meeting of City Council on 2/15/2023 and present his observations and recordings about the disturbing sounds, and it's personal impact on him and other area residents. Matt asked, "wouldn't doing this next week make this matter become public?" Matt also emphasized his desired actions were for a quick resolution to the disturbing noises.

In response to that suggestion from Roger as presented by Matt, the city officials and attendees generally agreed that he should hold off on attending a City Council meeting. The thinking and discussion was that such a presentation could expand the scope of the situation and get others involved, and possibly including the press. Robin and others again suggested that the non-confrontational approach would be better.

Matt agreed and even stated in his initial conversation with Roger they discussed that maybe next week would be too aggressive and perhaps the March meeting would be better.

Robin stated that the issue is not a council issue. Matt responded to this stating that the EPA said to call council, the police captain said to call council, community development said to call council and now we are being told it isn't for council. Robin said people will have different opinions about who should be handling this we need to figure who that would be. Law Director Hope stepped in and stated that council needs to help and she was going work with her boss to set up a meeting with LOL in the next couple of weeks.

Both Hope and Joan suggested that the city officials arrange a meeting with LOL Plant management, including Matt and several other representatives of the group present at the meeting. Hope said Land O'Lakes is normally receptive to city requests. Hope noted that her boss was out of town the next day, so she would talk to him early next week.

Robin Turner at this time concurred with the idea of a sit-down meeting with city officials, LOL management and some of the residents affected by the disturbing sounds. One of Robin's main points was emphasizing the importance of a low-key meeting with the LOL personnel in a non-confrontational manner, and just asking to discuss the situation and what can be done for a resolution.

The conclusion to the above discussion and the meeting was that Hope Jones would proceed early next week with setting up the meeting with top level city officials, Land O'Lakes officials, Matt and some additional residents from Shaw Drive who are impacted by the disturbing sounds

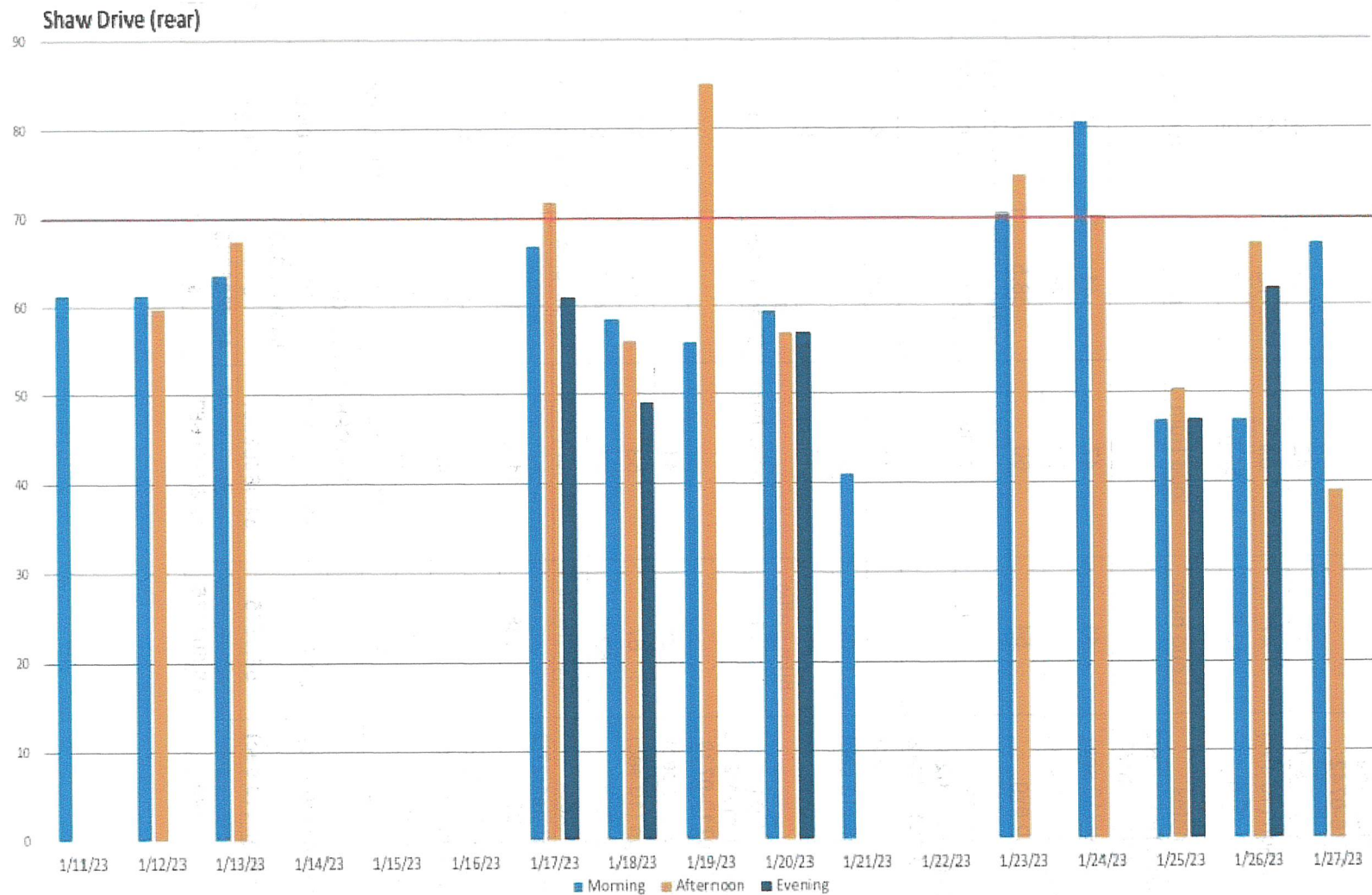

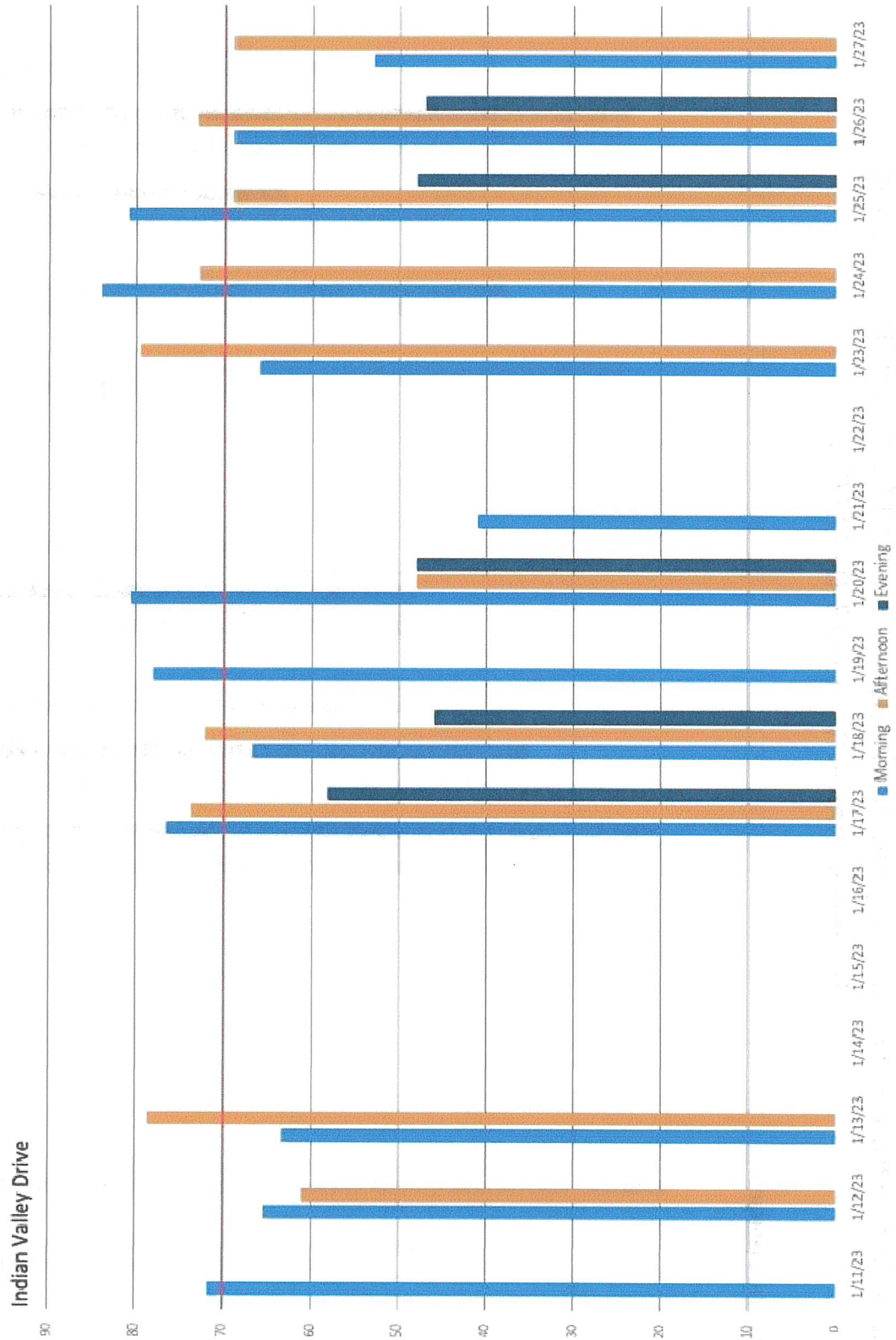

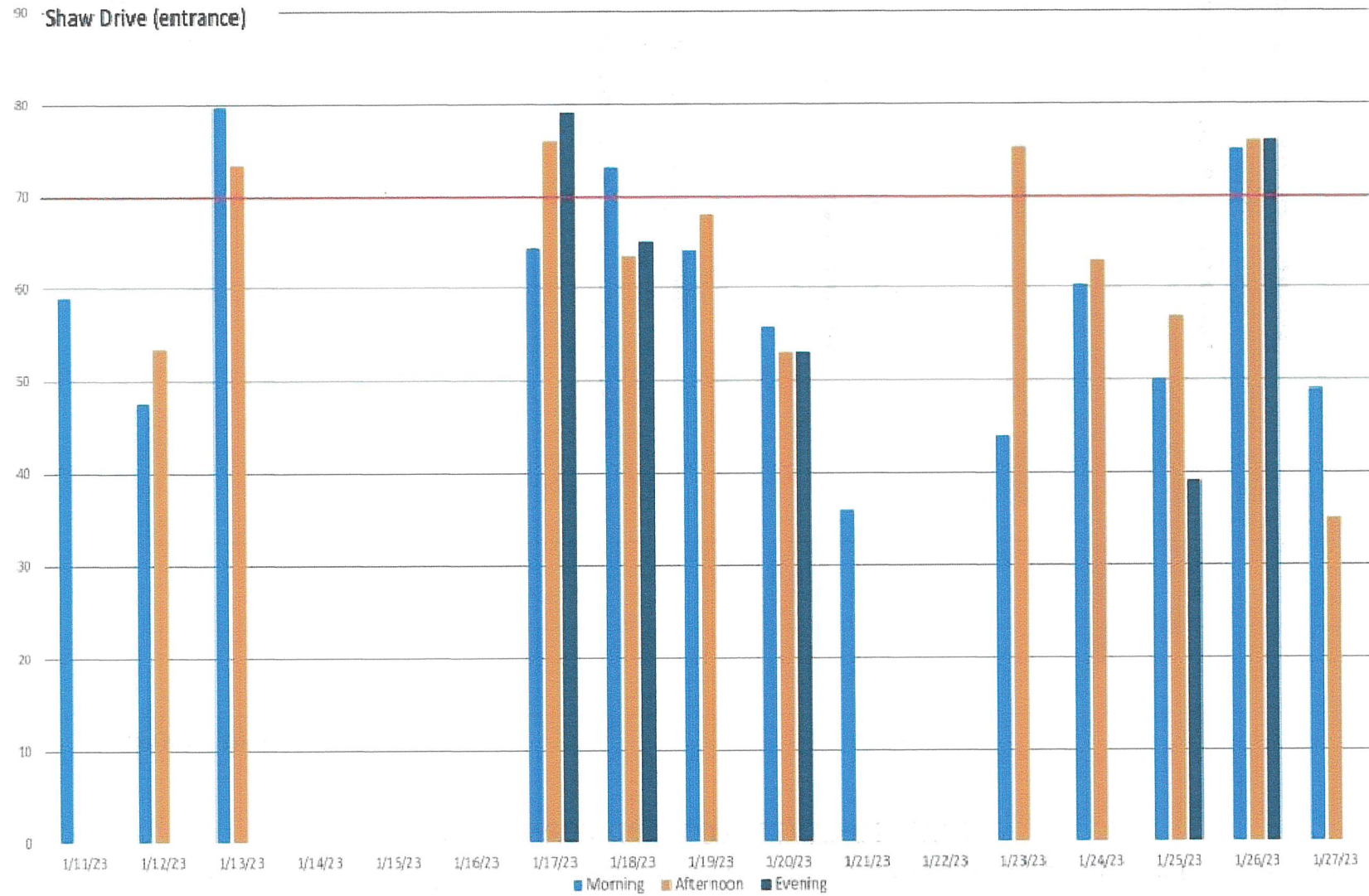
Decibel readings by Kent City Health Department and Community Development between dates 01/11/23-01/27/23



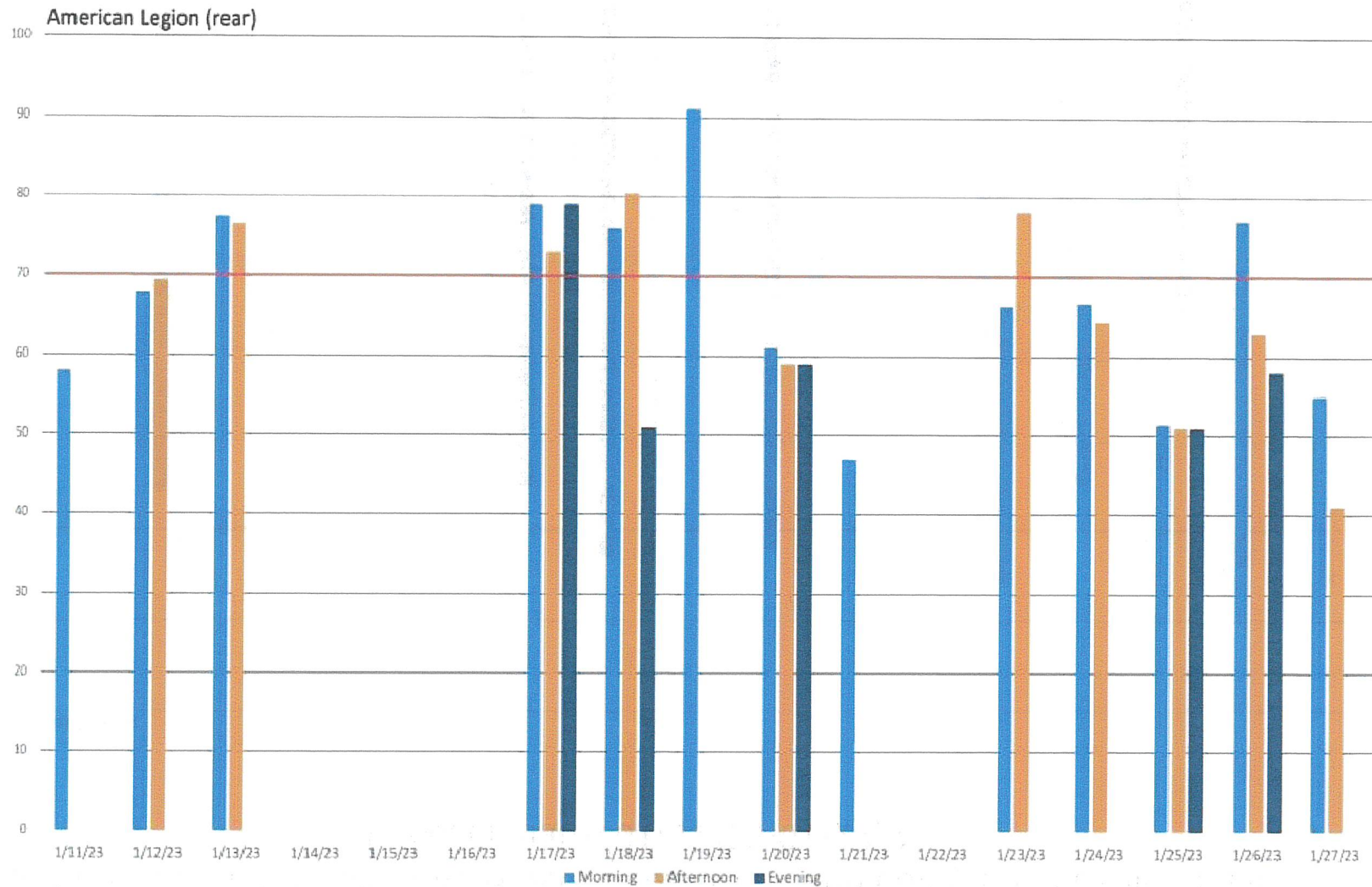

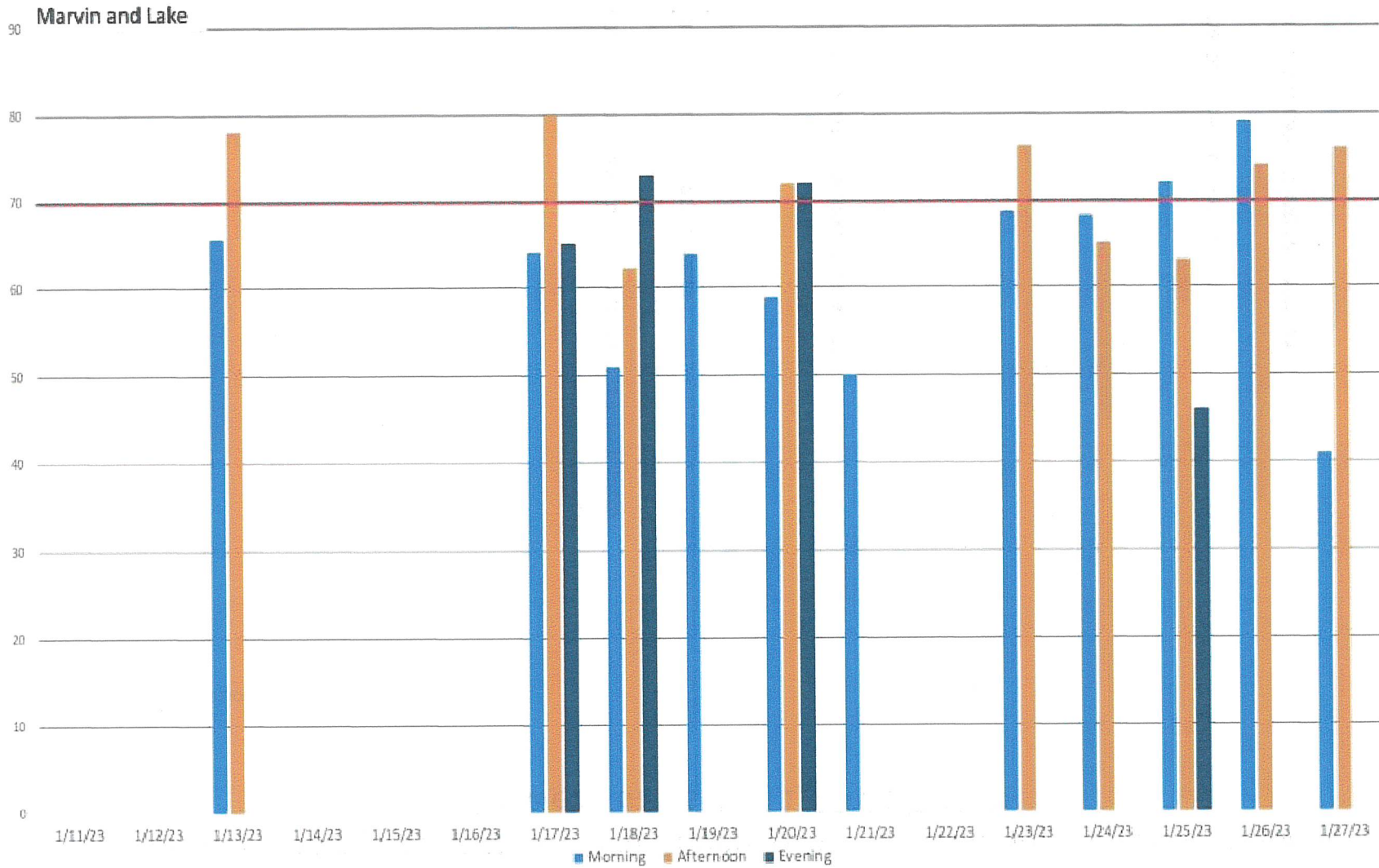

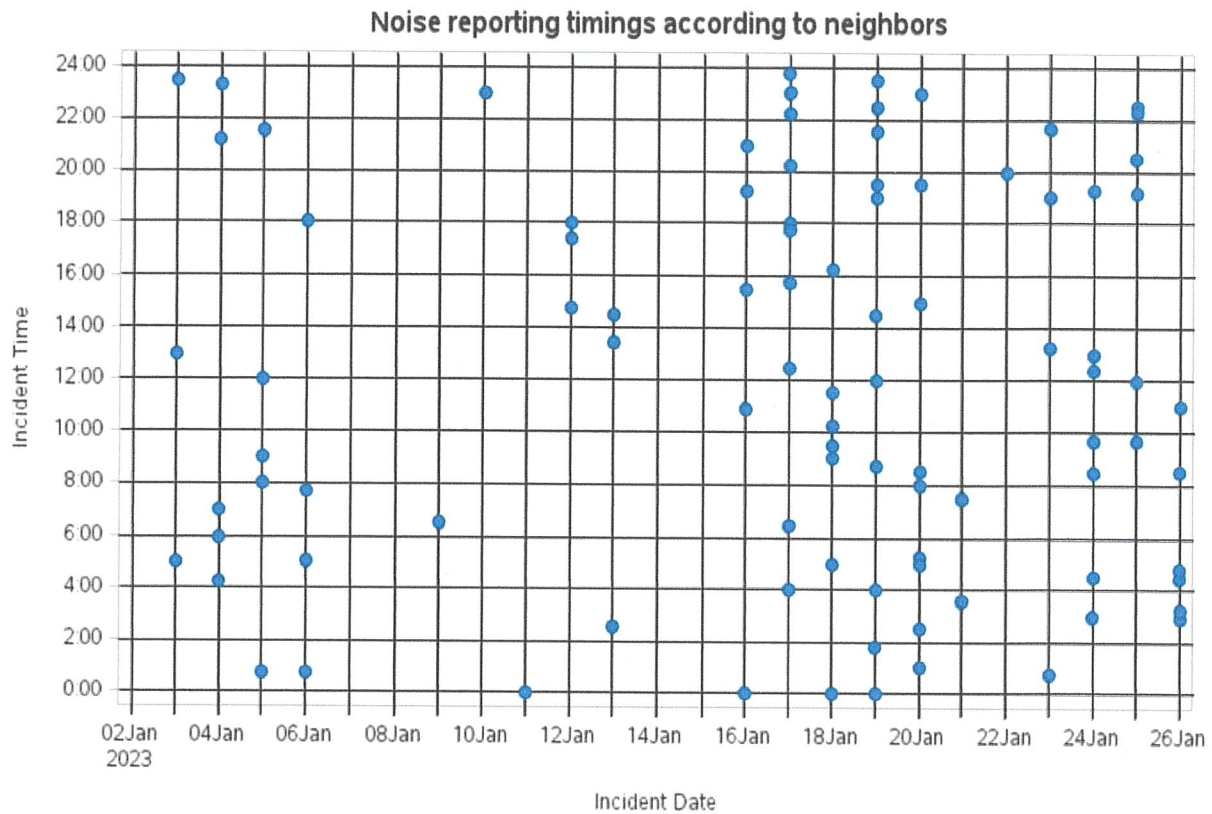

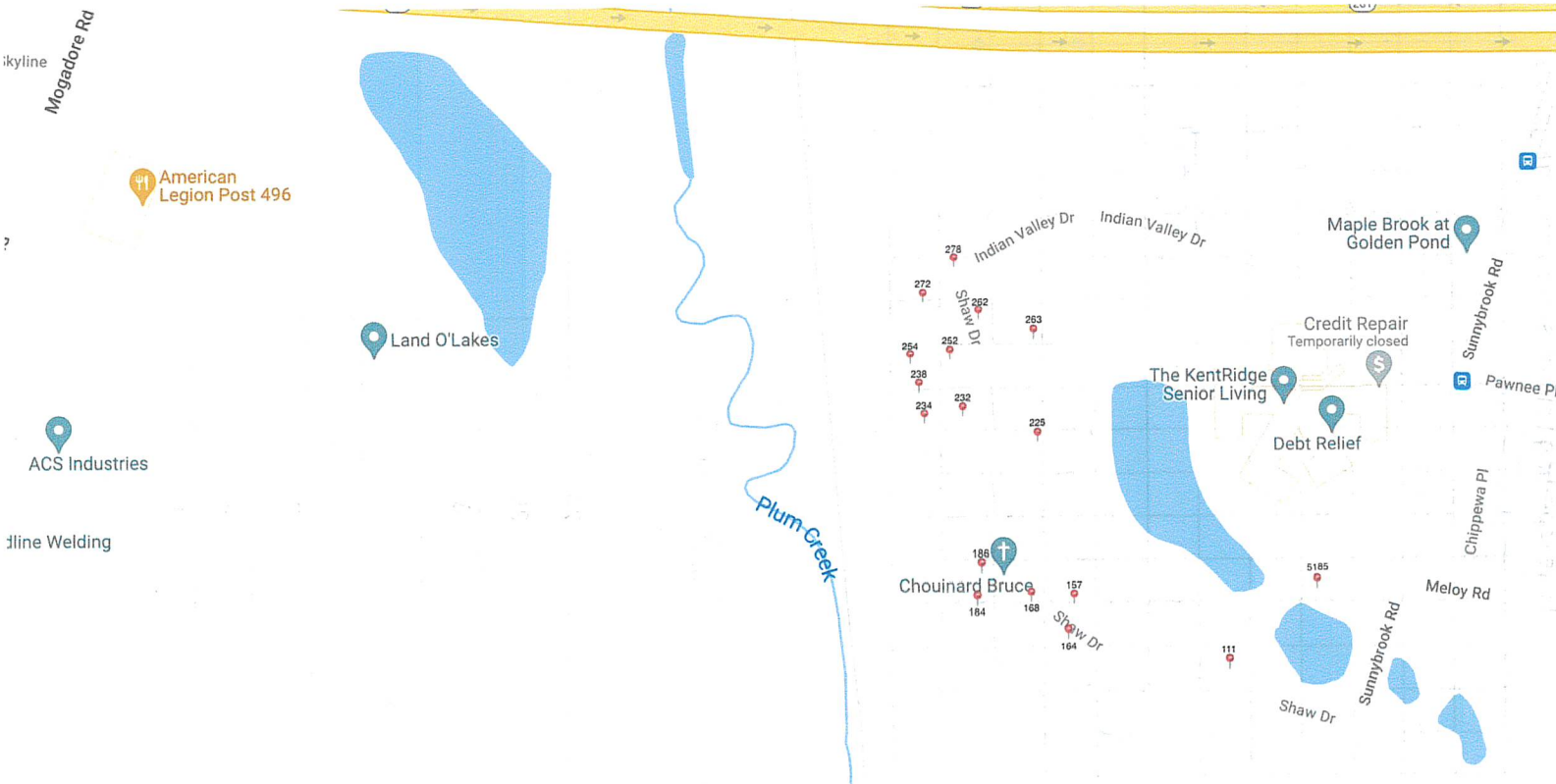


Scatter Plot

I showed him the droning noise from videos I took of the walls in my room when the sound was going last Friday morning at 4am, he acknowledged that noises were coming right through the walls. I explained that these frequencies need to be contained at the source nothing we do as residents will block this. I showed him how I had the house reinsulated as a desperate attempt to help. I also showed him on a frequency analyzer that the hum bounces between 140-150hz. Those are the tones of the pulsating that are easier to hear indoors because the walls block out the higher frequencies, but the low tones pass through, I demonstrated this effect for him by cutting out the high tones. I also showed him recordings of the constant hum that doesn't pulsate that were captured on my outdoor cameras. He asked about a banging and stated it was the trains. I showed him recordings of the bangs to prove it's not the trains because you can clearly hear the backing beeps of the trucks used to slam the dumpsters at the facility. He knew it was Republic immediately after hearing this because he heard it himself when he was doing water tests near the plant. I asked that he share this visit with Joan.

01/19/23	9:30 PM	Very loud humming / rumbling noise coming from the blowers/motors at the Land O Lakes Plant. 4 years but definitely has worsened over the last year. Land O Lakes Plant in the rear of the building
01/19/23	4:00 AM	Loud "whirring" sound (medium to low pitch) coming from the L O L plant. It was loud enough to keep me awake for several hours. When I got up this morning about 8 am it was still going. We were away all afternoon so don't know if it continued or not. Haven't heard it yet tonight, but wind has been blowing and raining. 01/19/23	7:30 PM	Same droning as usual. Began to hear it in my back bedroom around 7:00pm. Same routine as before, on for 30-40 minutes then off for 10 minutes or less. I can't even imagine how bad it is across the street whose houses face that plant.

01/19/23	7:00 PM	The "normal" rumble increased significantly at 7:00 pm and continued until approximately 7:40 pm. I say "approximately" 7:40 because wind and rain started around 7:30 pm and created some noise, too. Off & on, for several years
01/20/23	1:00 AM	Loud obnoxious droning noise from the plant. Its permeating the whole house including our back bedroom. Now 330 am and we can't sleep.. Same deal as before, 45 minutes on and then shuts off for 10 minutes. This is getting very annoying very fast. How they can claim that it's not them is amazing. Can no one Working over there hear this noise coming from their plant? Impossible.
01/20/23	2:30 AM	Weekly every Thursday night, (and most other nights), pulsating noise coming from the Land O' Lakes plant behind our condo. It wakes us every night it happens, which is probably 4-6 nights a week and continues until after daylight. Can't get back to sleep, so up at 2;30-3:00 am every night. Ear plugs and sound machines don't help, it can be heard through them. Who can live like this? Please imagine what this would be like if it occurred in your home for years! The noise was very loud at about 3pm yesterday as well. This condo complex never should have been zoned and built right next to a factory. If Land O'Lakes would mitigate this noise it would solve this nightmare.

There is almost 98% of the time some sort of droning or high pitched noise coming from there.

01/21/23	7:30 AM	AY!! No noise. Saturday and Sunday are the days they must be shut down at LOL Plant. Today and tomorrow we will be without the constant noise. Thanks for reading all of the forms that I have been sending in.
01/21/23	3:30 AM	The noise from Land o Lakes building sounds like a washing machine, I hear it before I go to bed and it wakes me up at 3 ,5 & 7 a.m. I've heard it everyday this week. It's constant. Mostly in the middle of the night
01/23/23	1:15 PM	Loud humming noise coming from the blowers / motors at the Land O Lakes Plant
01/23/23	7:00 PM	Just want to let you know the LOL Plant has been up and running with its usual loud humming noise. Started this morning after being quiet on Saturday and Sunday. I just walked in my bedroom and the noise is just soooo loud. I know it will be keeping me from falling asleep tonight. It is non stop. If the noise stops, it only stops for 5 minutes. If it stops for a longer period of time than that, I have never heard it experienced that. Thank you for reading my note. 01/24/23	4:30 AM	Pulsating hum still going at 4:28am not able to stay asleep. Took 3 sleeping pills at 9pm woken up at 2am from noise not able to fall back asleep because it won't stop. Since early 1/23

		Very loud pulsating coming from Land O'Lakes can be heard over the TV. This starts up EVERY Sunday night and goes on nightly, getting louder at about 2-3am. Thursday mornings at 3am and Friday mornings at about 3am seem the loudest, though it can be heard in the home evenings around 6pm on. It seems to quiet down between 11am or so and 1pm during the lunch hour. The last 3 driveways on the left side of Shaw Dr. where the factory lights are very visible at night seem to get it the worst. Listeners have come to the Cul de Sac to listen and not get out of their cars. You need to come up the sets of driveways to gage just how bad this is for the homes there during the worst times. I have seen people come to listen during their lunch hour...that is one of the only times the place quiets down some. Manufacturing varies and changes production depending upon their orders. The one thing that has been consistent is the evening and early morning pulsating, usually from 6pm or so to 7 am the next morning when it ramps down a little bit. There is always some noise coming out of the place but the loud pulsating is the worst. If this is mitigated the problem would be solved.

I believe of course, that the weather, humidity, etc affect how the sound carries. I noticed today when we turned off the TV after lunch. 01/24/23	7:17 PM	Loud rumbling noise from the blowers / motors coming from the Land O Lakes Plant. Noise protruding through our walls and windows. Daily for the 4 years we have lived here but has worsened over the past year. Rear side of building at the Land O Lakes Plant.

From my personal knowledge, this almost constant industrial noise has been going on for, at least, five years. Is it what I find to be a disturbance? Absolutely. Has it damaged my health? Ear plugs, loud fans, pillows and blankets jammed against the wall and behind bed, heavy curtains.... nothing keeps it away.. At times slept on a hard lawn chair in an inner bathroom in the condo for a "normal" night's sleep. No one should have to live this way let alone people who have worked hard all their lives and want a peaceful retirement. This housing should never have been zoned for this area up against such loud industry.
01/26/23	4:45 AM	Noise from land olakes still going. Not able to sleep again tonight. Noticed droning around 8:30pm and still going at almost 5am. Alarm to wake up goes off at 6:45am if I'm lucky I'll get almost 2 hours of sleep before I have to work today.
01/26/23	8:30 AM	The droning manufacturing sounds carried quite well in the damp air yesterday, overnight, and this morning. I could hear the pulsing as I awakened as at various times in the middle of the night.
01/26/23	11:00 AM	Loud humming noise coming from Land O Lakes plant has been consistently going since 8:30pm last night. It woke me up several times throughout the night & my husband didn't get any sleep. It has been over 14 hours of this noise.

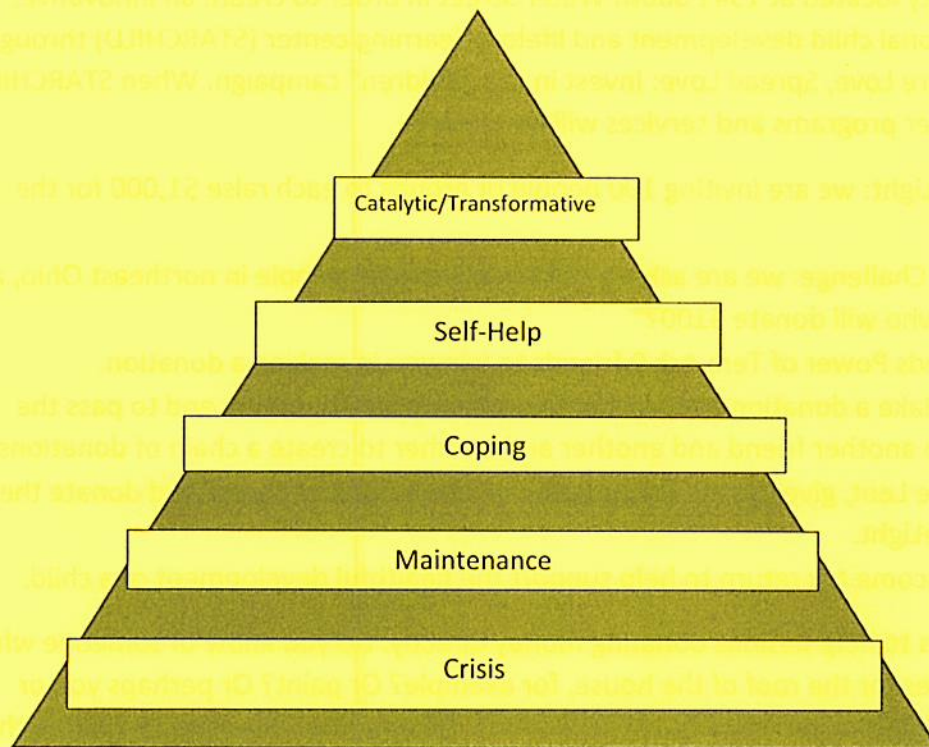

Thus, we work to bring together the fields/sectors of education, health, social service, recreation, criminal justice, government, and communities of worship in a cooperative effort to optimize the development and empowerment of young people, particularly lower-income children, teens, and families. Our focus is on the upper end of the Justice Hierarchy of Social Service, i.e. directed toward "coping", "self-help", and "catalytic (transformative)" efforts

The LoveLight Story

In November of 1995, a small group of people with a big vision created LoveLight, Inc. to help people, especially those considered economically or otherwise disadvantaged, to move toward reaching their potential and to promote positive, healthful lifestyles. Non-profit status was granted in 1996 and LoveLight began providing free summer lunches and activities for children in lower-income neighborhoods in Kent, Ohio and other local communities. These lunches helped fill the gap when school lunches were not available, promoted healthful lifestyles, and built a sense of community among program participants.

In addition, during the nine weeks of LoveLight's 2019 summer program, 5,820 shelf-stable weekend meals were distributed to children in lower-income families living in eight neighborhoods in Kent and Ravenna.

Due to the COVID pandemic, during our summer 2020 program, a total of 14, 838 meals were picked up and taken home from four Kent neighborhood sites as well as the Brimfield Community Cupboard, i.e. LoveLight provided 7,419 non-congregate breakfasts and 7,419 non-congregate lunches. At the Kent sites, activities were also sent home for the children. The federal government extended the program, and between October 2020 and mid- August 2021, we distributed 35,722 non-congregate suppers and 31,588 non-congregate snacks in partnership with the Brimfield Community Cupboard and Renaissance Family Center for children in Kent, Brimfield, and Windham, and 4,153 non-congregate breakfasts for Kent children, for a total of 118,702 meals, over 31,588 snacks, and 5,820 shelf stable weekend meals for children since the summer of 1996.

A CARES grant through Portage County also financially supported the extended program and enabled the purchase of freezers and a refrigerator. In Kent, with the help of a grant from the City, activities were also sent home including magazine subscriptions, art lessons and supplies, books, and cooking tools as well as chef hats and aprons which were purchased and continued to enrich the lives of the children in the subsequent months.



When school resumed for the 2021-2022 year, LoveLight sent home a weekly activity and snack for children in four Kent neighborhoods as well as providing magazine subscriptions to The Week Junior and arranging for five youth to attend Kent State's art experiences program for children in first through sixth grade.

Since our first summer, with the help of many individuals and organizations including local churches and Kent State University as well as some funding from grants, LoveLight has undertaken a number of projects focused on the healthful development and well-being of youth, particularly those who are low income. Besides the summer lunch and ABC's of Fun summer program, other initiatives have included:

- Traveling Playground involving university students (mostly future teachers) who planned and carried out educational and enrichment activities with youngsters in low-income neighborhoods; LoveLight's Executive Director gave a presentation on the Traveling Playground at the 2003 UNESCO Conference on International Education in Finland;
- StudyBuddies, which consisted of pairs of college students assisting pairs of public school children with their academics;
- LoveLight Learning Center and neighborhood tutoring;
- Licensed afterschool program for children ages 5 through 14;
- In conjunction with Kent City Schools and community partners, PEAKS mentoring program for lower-income eighth-grade "at-promise" youth;
- Building Community, Building Futures activities for youth in local low-income neighborhoods;
- Professional Learning Communities (PLC) Academy which over three school years, provided professional development for teams of P-12 educators (270 individuals) in order to create Professional Learning Communities in their respective schools to increase student learning and teacher retention as well as improving school climate; the academies were held at Kent State and participants had the option to receive workshop credit from KSU if they engaged in further work under the direction of LoveLight's executive director.
- Initiating Rhythmic Movement Training Symposia held at Kent State University and presented by Swedish psychiatrist Dr. Harald Blomberg. BRMT exercises, which mimic natural baby movement patterns, have been found to improve attention, cognitive, emotional and motor functioning, vision, reading, speech, and handwriting;
- Tutoring PLUS, one-on-one sessions for youth and adults experiencing difficulties with academic and/or overall functioning; these sessions are focused on addressing underlying causes of these difficulties.



In 2022, through a grant from the City of Kent, LoveLight provided summer activities for children in three Kent neighborhoods, resumed Tutoring PLUS, which had been interrupted by the pandemic, and initiated a program, Exploring the Black Experience, in collaboration with the Department of Africana Studies at Kent State. This day- and-a-half program for Kent middle and high school students included sessions on nutrition, a luncheon, "Breaking Bread with the Elders" with people active in community service, "Celebrating Black Hair", "Creating Your Future", and time spent with members of the community discussing their stories and sharing their experiences in various careers. In addition, the youth received a set of Black history cards as well as books- *Who Owns the Ice House: Eight Life Lessons from an Unlikely Entrepreneur*, *Live Your Dreams*, *Glory: Magical Visions of Black Beauty*, *How to Turn \$100 into \$1,000,000*, and *The Higher You Climb, the Broader the View: From the Jim Crow South to a Thriving Northern Community, A Memoir (autographed)*.

LoveLight's first Multicultural Holiday Festival was held in November, featuring a Christmas tree auction, vendor tables offering a variety of quality craft and artisan products, a raffle of donated items, children's activity table, and an outdoor display of art created from tires. Our hope is to make this festival an annual event, celebrating community, supporting local entrepreneurship, and raising funds to support LoveLight programs.

LoveLight's goals for the future include the creation of a model, intergenerational child development and lifelong learning center/community. STARCHILD is an acronym for Service, Teaching, Advocacy, and Research Center for Human Integration, Learning and Development, reflecting a broad vision extending beyond the immediate benefits of a nurturing, stimulating, and health-promoting environment for the low-income and other children enrolled in the program.



This facility will not only help us to "feed children for a day", but also "feed children for a lifetime."

Imagine...

... Highly qualified staff, early childhood pre-service teachers, and senior citizens interacting with preschool children from families of various income levels to create a wonderful nurturing, engaging, developmentally

appropriate and aesthetically pleasing environment, which will include natural sunlight, indoor plants, and mirrors to encourage body image and awareness;

... Babies, toddlers, and pre-school children enjoying gross motor activities designed to develop their cognitive, movement, and social skills.

... In the infant/baby area, painted in rainbow colors, cribs, rocking chairs, and a carpet area to provide "belly time" for healthful sensorimotor experiences;

... Youth of all ages playing outdoors in the fresh air and sunshine so important to their healthy growth and development.

... Mini-hikes on uneven terrain, communing with nature while building strong bones and healthy vestibular systems.

... Children, senior citizens, and community health faculty and students creating a bountiful garden of vegetables, a process beneficial in itself as well as yielding fresh produce to include in nutritious meals and snacks enjoyed by the children in companionship with each other.

... Delighted pre-school children gathering sun-ripened strawberries, grapes, and other fruit that they have planted.

... Children, teens, and adults spending quiet time in the peace garden surrounded by beautiful flowers.

... Pre-school and school-age children enjoying creative activities, science, and nature exploration.

... Storytelling and reading stories with "grandmas", "grandpas", and college students serving as honorary big brothers, sisters, and grandparents.

... Children riding tricycles in an outdoor pavilion which can also be used for community activities.

... Musical and dramatic performances on the stage in the renovated building on the property.

... STARCHILD children engaging in such activities as imaginative play, building with blocks, games, art, music, poetry, stories, drama, science, math, and social studies exploration using a developmentally appropriate approach.

... LoveLight programs such as Tutoring PLUS, youth entrepreneur club, community theater, and community events, for example, a health fair, senior socials, and chess tournaments.

We are currently looking at purchasing an 8.5 acre property in Kent which includes a former church and a house, to enable LoveLight to fulfill this mission. Beautiful acreage will provide many opportunities to engage in learning about and enhancing an appreciation for the natural environment. In addition, ample grounds offer many opportunities for the children to enjoy the fresh air and outdoor play so important for healthy development. Although childhood has been represented as a carefree time of life, the reality today is that many children suffer from stress and anxiety; in the peace garden they will learn relaxation techniques, coping skills that will continue to be useful on into adulthood.

The "Golden Treasures" component of STARCHILD will feature interaction between senior citizens and children, enriching the lives of both. Our strong focus on supporting healthful child development will include not only such elements as nutritious food; gross and fine motor activities; language, creative, and expressive arts including music activities; and science and math exploration, but also other developmentally appropriate activities designed to establish a strong foundation for future success. As with other LoveLight initiatives, STARCHILD will not only benefit the participating children and their families as well as the local economy, but will also provide a wealth of opportunities for university and high school students to gain valuable experience related to their coursework.

When STARCHILD is not in session, we anticipate offering community activities such as an entrepreneurial and empowerment program for teens and events for senior citizens. In addition, we will continue to offer such STAR Institute services as workshops and Tutoring PLUS, innovative one-on-one sessions involving the identification and addressing of the underlying causes of learning and functioning difficulties. For example, participants and their parents will experience and be taught stress reduction techniques and Blomberg Rhythmic Movement Training exercises to practice at home.

We anticipate that the work of The STAR Institute and its foundational program, STARCHILD, will provide benefits well beyond its immediate environment, eventually impacting quality of life and promoting future success for children and their families in communities throughout northeastern Ohio.

Our guiding principles will continue to be:

- Respect and care for yourself
- Respect and care for each other
- Respect and care for the world around you
